5. <u>Discussion Regarding Subsurface Drip Irrigation Systems</u>

Kristin Dickinson introduced Kevin Hutsell, NRCS-USDA Nebraska Irrigation Engineer. He presented information and facilitated discussion on subsurface drip irrigation. Discussion followed.

6. Director and staff Reports

Sanders-read flow meters throughout the month.

<u>Kaiser</u>-took water levels and prepared the water level report for this meeting. He did stream monitoring and he and Wittrock repaired a SPNRD monitoring well.

<u>Reisdorff</u>-attended POAC and PBC meetings, worked on the Oliver Reservoir Streamflow Enhancement project and read industrial and irrigation flow meters.

Glanz-read industrial flow meters, worked on the quarterly report for the grant, Hydrogeology of Western Nebraska and some issues relating to scanning logs from the Nebraska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission. He provided water usage information to ARI (Adaptive Resources Inc.), worked through some GIS Workshop usage report issues, worked on some ownership changes and assisted Dinklage with some certified irrigated acre issues. Glanz reported that Sanders has been a tremendous help reading flow meters all throughout Deuel, Kimball and north and south Cheyenne counties.

<u>Davis</u>-passed around a thank you from Paul and Colleen Hutchison, the Conservation Farm Award winners. He attended the I&E meeting in Wahoo and worked on marketing and promotional items. He, Suhr and Keller moved back into the remodeled office work area. The Pipeline Newsletter is in the process of completion. He reported that one school, Kimball 6th grade, participated in the NACD state poster contest, "We all need Trees". The District's winner will be sent to the state competition. The NARD Tree booklet revisions were completed and submitted for finalizing.

<u>Wittrock</u>-reported that ORRA camping season is wrapped up. Camper comments were positive for the most part, making it a great year. Fire pits, cone pedestals and toilet seats have been ordered for the new fiscal year. The District participated with the City of Sidney in the Environmentally Adaptive Tree Initiative, planting 34 trees throughout the City of Sidney. He provided the latest East Sidney Watershed Project map design. The final design should be done by next month. Bidding and construction are the next phases.

<u>Suhr and Horn</u> submitted written reports. Horn briefly discussed a portion of his report. <u>Halligan</u>-discussed items brought forward during the Platte River Basin meeting from Jerry Kenny (PRIPP) during the NARD Annual Conference.

9. General Reports

A. Fall 2016 SPNRD Ground Water Level Report

Kaiser summarized the results of the District's Fall 2016 Ground Water Level Measurement Program. This report is for informational purposes only. All water management decisions are based from the spring ground water level report. Also included in the report are data correlating precipitation changes from normal amounts compared to the average decline in ground water levels. A map is included with locations of the District's existing monitoring well network. Nine livestock wells and one new drilled monitoring well were added in 2016. Discussion followed. He requested board input for what they would like to see on the Spring 2017 report.

B. Review Grant Programs Summary for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2016

Suhr presented information via power point on the District's two Nebraska Environmental Trust grants, the FEMA/NEMA grant, the Water Sustainability Fund grant and the NET Grants in which the District participates through the Platte Basin Coalition (PBC).

10. Committee Reports

A. <u>District Operations Committee</u>

1. *Consideration to Purchase and Install New Digital Desk Telephone System

Narjes discussed that the committee reviewed the proposal for an AVAYA digital telephone system. Tim Miller, Miller Office Products, attended the committee meeting. The District's current analog telephone system is outdated with rising replacement costs. Motion by Narjes on behalf of the committee to waive the District's Operating Policy #26 (bidding process) and authorize staff to work with Miller Office Products to purchase and install the AVAYA system including 12 new telephones, not to exceed \$6,750. A second was made by Johnson. After discussion, a roll call vote was taken.

B. Natural Resources/Projects and Programs Committee

1. <u>Discussion Regarding Nebraska Board of Education Lands and Funds (BELF) Transfer of Certified Irrigated Acres</u>

Maas discussed that Joe Martin, Board of Education Lands and Funds, came to the committee meeting requesting a transfer of the certified irrigated acres for a tract near the west side of Sidney. Glanz discussed reasons that a variance would be necessary; especially the two-mile rule, not having 50% of allocation used and that it would cross subarea boundaries. The tract hasn't been irrigated for more than 10 years. Discussion followed. The board was in agreement that a transfer would not be an option. Glanz will work with Martin on other options.

 *Discussion and Action as Desired Concerning Matt Varra's Violations of the Amended and Restated Districtwide Ground Water Management Area Rules and Regulations/Compliance Plan. Such Violations occurred on Certified Irrigated Acres owned by VS Hay Company, LLC with Tract Identification Number described as Tract #15N54W070001, all located in Kimball County, Nebraska

Glanz led the discussion that Varra sold 621,080 gallons of water while bypassing the flow meter. Varra called Glanz and told him what he did. After speaking with Glanz, Varra applied for a SPNRD Transfer Permit and provided a compliance plan. The violation occurred from the NE¼ of Section 7, Township 15 North, Range 54 West, Kimball County, Nebraska. An industrial flow meter will be necessary for sale of water. The committee was in agreement to recommend approval of Varra's corrective action plan including 1) Varra will no longer sell water from irrigation well G-067208, 2) reduction of 22.82 acre-inches from the tract, 3) penalty of 22.82 acre-inches, 4) application for a Transfer Permit and pay the \$200 fee, and with the proposed amendment that the Transfer Permit must be completed by June 1, 2017. The transfer permit will be brought before the board for approval. Maas moved on behalf of the committee to approve Matt Varra's corrective action plan as amended: 1) Varra will no longer sell water from irrigation well G-067208; 2) Varra will have a reduction of 22.82 acre-inches from the tract; 3) Varra will have a penalty of 22.82 acre-inches; 4) Varra will apply for a SPNRD Transfer Permit and he will pay the \$200 fee; and 5) the Transfer Permit must be completed by June 1, 2017; otherwise, the permit will be denied. Second by Rutt. With no further discussion, a roll call vote was taken.

3. <u>Update on the Oliver Reservoir Streamflow Enhancement Project and Amended Scope of Work</u>

Reisdorff, working with Olsson Associates and public input, discussed two options or a combination of the following: a dam or dike/berm on the north east shallow area of the reservoir to narrow the water pool (a 404 permit may be required); and drilling a high-capacity well on the south side of the reservoir to maintain levels. Phase II and III of the contract with Olsson Associates would be affected by the amended scope of work. A test well will be drilled to evaluate whether that is a viable option. Discussion followed.
